Dear Westview,

At the January 2023 stated meeting of session we approved a recommendation from the facility master plan team to solicit feedback from the congregation this coming month of March regarding congregational support for a three-year capital campaign.

The purpose of the campaign would be to raise funds to eliminate \$142,000 in debt before our balloon payment is due in April of 2026 and fund engineering studies needed to design and cost estimate the renovation priorities identified by the congregation of a single-family restroom in the sanctuary pod, replace the flooring in Fellowship Hall, and a major kitchen renovation.

Town Hall Meeting

We will be holding a town hall meeting after worship on March 5th to gather congregational feedback on the proposed campaign.

Congregational surveys regarding the capital campaign will be handed out March 5th, and for people unable to attend worship, they will receive an email with the survey or in the regular mail. The surveys will include questions regarding your emotional and financial support of a possible campaign and your interest of serving on one of the three capital campaign teams: The Prayer Committee, The Thanks Committee, and The Communications Committee.

After months and months of work, this is the final step in the process of holding a capital campaign. Depending on the results of the congregational feedback, we hold the possibility of conducting the campaign after Easter Sunday, April 9th and to be concluded with a campaign pledge Sunday May 14th, 2023.

We all feel the sting when we go through the checkout line, and I'm sure you know that some people feel the sting more than others. The grocery budget doesn't go as far as it did even a few months ago, and many of our neighbors face the challenge of deciding where they can cut costs.

More and more families are turning to Community Food Share for help. Since the beginning of the year, We've seen a **59% increase in the average number of households we serve each week** at our Feeding Families Onsite Pantry.

Thanks to you, we can ensure that neighbors facing food insecurity have access to fresh produce, dairy, high-protein foods, and pantry staples they need and deserve.


