Dear Westview,

Let's begin the New Year together! We have a few important events planned for Westview in January.

The first event is January 1st! We will kick-off the new year with a New Year's Renewal and Communion Service in The Gathering Place at 9:30am. The service will be different—not only are we not meeting in the sanctuary, Dr. Karin will be in Montana so we will be singing some Taize songs and appropriate Christmas carols, and we will be doing it acapella. I will also lead us in a special renewal in-the-new-year communion service and liturgy.

Other important events this month are the Session Retreat January 5th; the election of Robert Rose to serve as deacon on January 8th (FYI this is also the date when the Denver Broncos miserable season mercifully comes to an end); a town hall meeting regarding the 2023 budget after worship on January 15th; and our annual meeting of the congregation after worship on January 29th.

For this month's preaching schedule, I am taking a different thematic approach. As the church in the New Testament was led by elders, and the Greek word for elder is "presbuteros" (Presbyterian in English), I want to spend the month focusing on "spiritual eldering." Elderhood is not necessarily a chronological order. I don't automatically tap into eldering energy simply by aging. I have met older people who are not "elders," just "olders." I have met teenagers in oncology wards who have more spiritual maturity than people four times their age. I have also met older people who are angry and bitter and entitled. So elderhood is not about growing older, rather, it is a *stage* of human spiritual development. (If you really want a dive into elderhood as a stage of human development, read Dr. Bill Plotkin's "Nature and the Human Soul" where he outlines eight stages of human development, two of which are elderhood).

THE ROUND PANTRY 2023



The Round Pantry prays that in this New Year you will find happiness in new friends, peace in new places and renewed hope in the Love of The Spirit. And, we raise similar prayers for those who visit The Round Pantry.

In our final Pantry of 2022, we served 489 households through the Drive Line distribution and another 752 in Community [Agency] Distribution. Ongoing cash donations to the Pantry budget, special donations of cash and food from local church partners and businesses/community groups, and the food supplies gathered and gleaned by Community Food Share provided over 35,000 pounds of food.

For that same Pantry, 150 volunteers worked to get this large amount of food to the shoppers. Special thanks go to all the volunteers who went above and beyond braving cold weather, taking on extra shifts, and extending their shifts with smiles and caring for their fellow volunteers and the shoppers.

The sincere expressions of gratitude and even tears of shoppers let us know that this is important work and that our efforts and prayers continue to be needed. Comments convince us that shoppers and volunteers see God at work.

On behalf of all of the shoppers we have served in 2022, we thank you so much for your prayers, donations of food and money and for your hard work! And, we pray that with this support and God's provision in the New Year, The Round Pantry can continue to be the hands and feet and hearts of Christ sharing God's love and light.






