The Apostle Paul, Colossians 1:24-27

Dear Westview.

The above scripture passage from Colossians is, in my humble opinion, one of the great underappreciated passages in all the Bible. Notice in verse 26: a mystery, kept hidden for ages and generations, has now been revealed to us. The mystery? Christ in you.

During the season of Lent we anticipate and prepare for a divine transaction: Christ dies on a cross for the sins of the world. But we also remember the great mystery revealed, made possible by Easter morning—the risen Christ lives within us in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Here is a prompt for you to reflect on this month you may have never put much thought into: Christ's presence within means Christ is revealed *in my body*. How does that sound? This is a challenging truth, especially when our physical body doesn't cooperate well and can become riddled with aches and pains if not worse. Have you considered Christ may be revealing himself through your physical body, including your aches and pains? Remember, we are talking about a mystery

Capital Campaign Study

The month of March also concludes our process on whether or not to conduct a three-year capital campaign after Easter to eliminate debt and raise funds for other priorities identified by the congregation. We have created a survey (which we will go over in the town hall meeting after worship on March 5th) and we hope everyone will complete and hand into the church office by March 12th. The survey will be in the church bulletin, emailed to the congregation, and sent by US mail to those unable to be in worship and/or are not online with email.

Why another survey? For this simple reason: Whether or not to raise significant funds beyond the annual budget is not a session decision. Nor is it a pastor decision. This level of change and commitment needs to be a congregational decision, and the survey is a way to discern what people in the church truly feel about it.

At the end of the process the session can go to the church and say, "This is what the congregation says about raising funds" from your honest input.

Lent Preaching Schedule

The central message of Jesus was "kingdom of heaven" breaking into our lives. We don't live under a monarchy, and it may be a bit of a stretch to understand what a "kingdom" feels like and what it means to live in one. Some biblical scholars translate the kingdom of heaven as the "realm and rule" of God, but still, what is the "realm" of God? It sounds like God sitting on a throne and far-removed with daily life to me. A better way to understand the kingdom of heaven may be something more like a "Presence." God is present and at work in our lives molding, shaping, and working through us on a constant basis.

One of the disciples of Jesus did a great thing for the church, not only did Matthew write a gospel, but he also collected seven stories Jesus told about the Presence—the kingdom of heaven—and put them back-to-back in the thirteenth chapter of his gospel. We know them as the Parables of Jesus. For our next sermon series launching in Lent, we are going to look at "The Seven Stories of Jesus" and learn more about how to experience the kingdom of heaven.



As we anticipate Spring, we hope for warmer temps, bright spring flowers and gentle breezes. And, we know from experience that we may still see bitter cold and more snow.

We hold hopes for our Pantry shoppers, as well – that their lives will be brighter - that they will have secure housing, access to food and respect for their efforts. And, we have reason to be worried (for example, the roll back of SNAP benefits.)

Our spirits are lightened by recent donations by partner churches – Light of Christ provided over 500 cake mixes, Christ Our Savior packages and brings us dry beans monthly. One of our student volunteers completed his school community service project by conducting a food drive and provided a choice of products to our shoppers in January, and CentraLongmont has just completed their annual Food Drive for The Round Pantry. The Round Pantry was blessed with end of year corporate and individual cash donations that will help fund our 2023 budget.



Our hopes are also held up by the support we receive from Westview Presbyterian Church and its people who frequently ask, "what can I do? Our answers are pretty much the same as always – and they matter just as much as always:

- **Donate cash** to purchase food items to fill out categories when orders are not enough
- Volunteer for a two hour shift or enlist your family or friends. Some our regular volunteers have been or will be away visiting family or have been ill and one volunteer experienced (non Pantry) injuries that will keep them from volunteering for a while. And, there is always a variety of tasks to be done on the second and fourth Sunday [afternoons], Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday [mornings.]
