#### The more things change...

Westview Prestryterian Church

Don't fret or worry. Instead of worrying, pray. Let petitions and praises shape your worries into prayers, letting God know your concerns. Before you know it, a sense of God's wholeness, everything coming together for good, will come and settle you down. Philippians 4:6-7 [The Message]

What worries us is sometimes that things change...and sometimes it's that things have stayed the same.

The mission and work of The ROUND PANTRY certainly falls on either side of this spectrum – The more things change, the more things stay the same / The more things stay the same, the more they change.

COVID caused us all to stay in, do the same thing every day, worry and wonder. And, for virtually everyone – it felt like everything changed. For our Pantry shoppers, this was the case ... lost jobs, school at home, worry about personal health and health of those distant from us, isolation mentally, physically and spiritually. And, as described by Community Food Share [CFS]: for many people in our community and our country, the pandemic was a tipping point — the push that caused them to visit a food pantry for the first time. We already had people who were struggling with food security, who were probably one paycheck away, and they lost that paycheck…" and then another and…

A recent report by Feeding America (the nation's largest domestic hunger-relief organization most highly rated by Better Business Bureau, Charity Navigator and Guidestar) included the following findings: <a href="mailto:lhttps://www.feedingamerica.org">[https://www.feedingamerica.org</a>]

Feeding America projects that 42 million people (1 in 8), including 13 million children (1 in 6), may experience food insecurity in 2021.

Many people who have been most impacted by the pandemic were food insecure or at risk of food insecurity before COVID-19 and are facing greater hardship since COVID-19.

It will likely take time for food insecurity levels to recover. The pandemic is not yet over, and the future remains tenuous for people who have experienced uncertain access to enough food for their families. After the Great Recession, it took nearly ten years, until 2018, for food insecurity to pre-recession levels, and even then, 37 million people were still at risk of hunger. While it may be likely that economic conditions will improve more quickly for some this time around, it will take continued support and public-private partnership across the government, the private sector, and the charitable food system to achieve the vision of an America where no one is hungry.

And, while we had hoped this summer that things were changing, a lot is still the same... Shoppers have not recovered from a year and a half of lost or reduced wages, health and the ability to work has declined, child-care is less available and even less affordable, food prices have risen, housing is in short supply and at a premium. And, so, the number of shoppers at The ROUND PANTRY that decreased over the summer has returned to the October 2020 level of 350 and is rising to an average 362 for the "month" just prior to press time.

An element that has remained fairly constant is the poundage available for distribution from CFS, donated food, and purchases made with donated funds. The September total received from CFS was just under 50,000 pounds and the summer average donations (direct donation of food and purchase of food with donated funds) was an average of 4,000 per month. Based on past experience, these totals literally 'fall in the fall'. As you can, we encourage you to support the Community Food Share, and consider 'final quarter' monetary donations to ROUND PANTRY.

Pantry volunteers from Westview, partner churches and community groups remain regular participants in this mission and we are routinely joined by new friends as we distribute the same nutritious food, warm smiles and the Love of God.

A change that will be put in place for the safety of our shoppers and volunteers is the institution of **New Hours** as it becomes darker earlier, the temperature drop and conditions can be icy and slick. Beginning on November 9, the Pantry Drive Line will be open from 2:00 to 6:00 p.m.

The ROUND PANTRY is continuing its efforts working with Facilities and Administration Ministry Area and Session. The boxes necessary to get food bagged and out to the driveline (that have been reused over and over since early 2020) will still need to be stored between Pantry weeks, but will soon be shielded by 'room divider' free-standing curtains. Gathering Place will be completely clear and over three-quarters of Fellowship Hall will be open (except when events such as Memorial Services require the alternate set-up).

As we move to more and more meetings, activities and events, everyone is asked to contact Sharon Boeye, Office Manager, about room use (both recurring and one-time) at least 48 hours in advance. 
