## PASTOR'S PEN

JULY 2023 NEWSLETTER

Dear Westview,

"Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness" (Matthew 4:1)

July 7-11 I will be at Highlands Retreat Center in Allenspark, co-guiding a five day/four-night immersion called "The Art of Belonging." Several members of Westview will be there as well as people from as far away as Victoria, BC, Delaware, Illinois, and Minnesota.

You might notice that I intentionally didn't call it a "retreat" or a "conference" but an "immersion." "The Art of Belonging" is not a conference in which the speaker presents content in several sessions, with perhaps some breakout sessions. It is not a "retreat" for we are not retreating from the world but entering more deeply into it. In fact, unless there is inclement weather, we will be outside all day and in tents by night.

What will we be doing? Great question! There is a rather rigorous schedule during my immersions. We always begin and end the five days with an opening and closing ceremony. Each day at breakfast we invite people to share their dreams from the night before, or a recent dream that is very alive for them. I love this kind of work because as a trained dreamworker I appreciate the depth and vulnerability of sharing dreams, rather than talking about what normally fills conversations over meals.

After breakfast we meet in a big group with invitations for "solo" time out on the land (we usually need a minimum of 200 acres for these types of events!). In the time out on the land, we take seriously "being led by the Spirit into the wilderness" and Colossians 1:16- 17 that states, "All things were created in Christ, for Christ, and through Christ," and "in Christ all things hold together." Certain invitations and guiding can provide a foundation to experience Christ in the natural world, and believe me, it is a game-changer.

In the afternoons we meet in small groups to process our wanders in the wild and receive deeper invitations from the guides. After dinner we have "story time with Uncle Dan" (at least that is how I joke about it) with some kind of spiritual practice around the magical time of twilight in the wild. *Continued on next page*

## FOOD PANTRY ASSISTANCE GRANT TO HELP OUR COMMUNITY



## COLORADO BLUEPRINT TO END HUNGER

The ROUND PANTRY at Westview Presbyterian Church has been awarded a \$10,000 grant to connect community members in need of food with more Colorado-grown produce, products, and nutrient-dense foods during this time of high need. We are one of 245 food pantries to be awarded emergency funding from the State of Colorado.

Food pantries across Colorado, like The Round Pantry, are experiencing increased demand within their communities. In addition to the continued impacts of inflation, the recent reduction in benefits for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) - related to the end of the public health emergency - has led to more families and individuals turning to food pantries for food assistance and nutritional support.

Recognizing the ongoing need in Colorado communities, state lawmakers and Gov. Polis allocated additional funding for quick release to local organizations that directly provide access to food in their communities. The grant distribution program exists to support organizations working directly in Colorado communities so everyone can access healthy food options near where they live. Grant opportunities are open to all food pantries in the state, with a focus on purchasing meat, dairy, and fresh produce from local farmers, ranchers, and producers.

The Round Pantry Leadership Team is pleased to receive this award at a time when shopper numbers remain at a high level and available food supplies are not as robust as in previous times. We want to thank the Governor's Office, Colorado Department of Human Services, and Colorado Blueprint to End Hunger for distributing funds to help food pantries like ours during this time of high need.
