CELEBRATION SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 12TH, 2023

Dear Westview,

I love the Apostle Paul's prayer for his people in the first chapter of Philippians:

And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may approve what is excellent and be blameless until the day of Christ, having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God. Philippians 1:9-11

The phrase that really catches my eye is "approve what is excellent." In order to not only do what is right but what is "excellent," Paul prays that their love may "overflow" with knowledge and depth of insight. Beautiful.

Thanks also to Wally Fleeger and family, and others who assisted or provided food for this lovely Luau Lunch.

SESSION NOTES

At their regular meeting on October 18, 2023, Session took the following actions:

- 1. Approved communion dates for 2024 on the first Sunday of each month and on Maundy Thursday.
- 2. Approved two changes to financial practices: who can sign checks, and the opening of a money market account to earn interest on our designated funds.
- 3. Approved a two-Sunday Adult class, lead by Pastor Dan, focused on the current situation in Israel using a PBS documentary to facilitate discussion.
- 4. Approved November 19, 2023 as date for the Congregational Meeting to receive the report of the Nominating Committee.
- 5. Had a discussion to establish the expense budget for 2024 in preparation for approving a final budget following the 2024 Stewardship Campaign.



Fall and fall holidays are full of nostalgia. We reminisce about times gone by. We think back on trips to the hills to see brilliant colors with family and friends.

We think back on the early days of Pantry - shopping, chatting, and.....waiting. On our busiest day, we served 308 households and it took more than an extra hour.

Now we're serving about double that number in the Tuesday Drive Line.

And while we have no nostalgia for COVID restrictions...

We do think fondly of our volunteers who are now not able or available to volunteer. And, we rejoice in the number of Westview volunteers and their friends from over 20 other churches who have come together to see that people in distress receive the food that they need.

As much as we think back on the way things used to be, things change. The reality is that we physically could not fit the number of shoppers we have now and the food they need into the Pantry space and time. And some things stay the same. As much as life and economics have returned to a better place, for many day to day living is difficult – uncertainty about housing, medical situations, SNAP benefit cuts, jobs that are available but unsteady, the reality of knowing that you don't know where your family's next meal with come from.

Pantry <u>is</u> different now; we don't have the same means of interaction with our shoppers. And, we have a new way of sharing food and love and light with our shoppers and our fellow volunteers. Consider becoming involved in volunteering – the group of volunteers has a strong fellowship - If you want to see how it all works, please pay us a visit. Please consider donating food that will go directly to someone in need. And, continue in your prayers for the people who come to The Pantry.

Nostalgia may bring sadness and it may bring warm memories for which we can be thankful.

At this time of year we think of upcoming holidays. It has been the practice for The Round Pantry to do something special at Thanksgiving and in the month of December.
